



Member/Special Interest Group Forum

- Best Practice (from meeting of MSIG discussion)
 - Attendance at events charging people to attend to try and increase the attendance percentage against registration. TVMG does charge for all technical meetings and have found that it hasn't reduced the number of people who have registered to attend, and have seen a slight increase in the number of attendees against registration. Other groups are considering this as an option. Some groups don't charge for events unless they incur a charge. Charging for networking social events (brewery tour, pub quiz) is common practice over all groups. Possibly introduce deposit system for high demand tours.
 - Collaboration of events F&D, LSECMG, TVMG have all collaborated with either other groups or PEIs and found that the additional support organising the events made it a lot easier on the committees and help expand advertising.

- A number of events were held. Costs were kept low by holding some events at Teesside University:

- 2018 Annual dinner net deficit of £948 (-ve balance)
 - Annual dinner is the largest event hosted by Teesside
 - Companies paid on time, however lower numbers
 - Expensive speaker


What is Congress?

 - Control its own agenda and how it operates

Inaugural Congress – Progress Summary

- Congress started on the 13th December 2018
- Online Communication System Set up
- Regular debate held on several key topics
 - IChemE Strategy 2024
 - Filling vacant seats (8 vacant)
 - Member engagement and communications
 - Communications between congress and the Board of Trustees



Inaugural Congress – Progress Summary

- We elected a Chair, Vice Chair and working group leaders
- Developing a better IChemE communication strategy
 - Data gathering and consultation
- Congress has worked with the Board of Trustees to produce the recent Member Survey
 - Congress has helped review the data
- The 32 members of congress will meet face to face (occurring at the same time as the AGM)



Inaugural Congress – Improvement Points

- Certain roles in congress require a significant time commitment
- The online platform works well and is satisfactory considering the global nature of congress
- The roles and responsibilities of congress within the IChemE is still fluid (versus other parts of the IChemE)
 - IChemE Board deliberately set this up
 - To be urgently discussed in May's face to face meeting

- Planning and Committee Succession
 - Having a plan for the progression of officer roles in the Teesside IChemE committee is important for the long term health of the group in this area.
