## Welcome

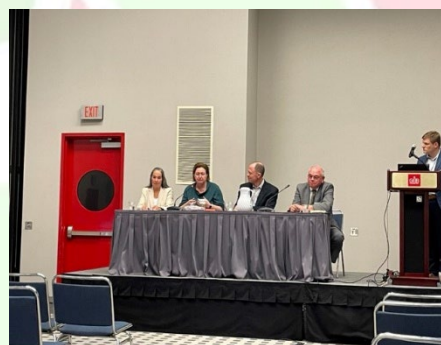
