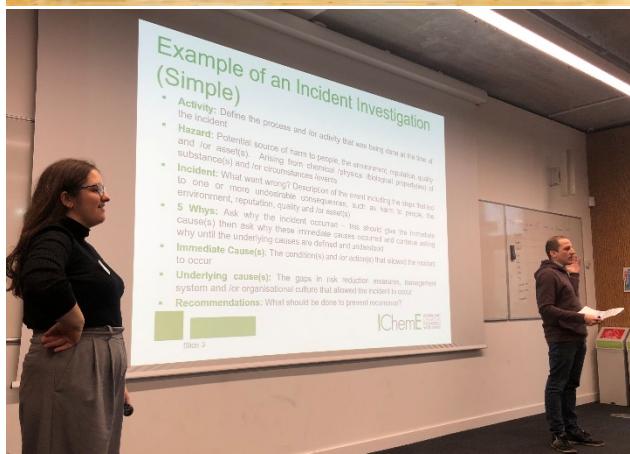


University Process Safety Workshops – 21 February and 28 February 2025

- ❖ Lancaster University – and an article has been published on the [School of Engineering webpage](#).



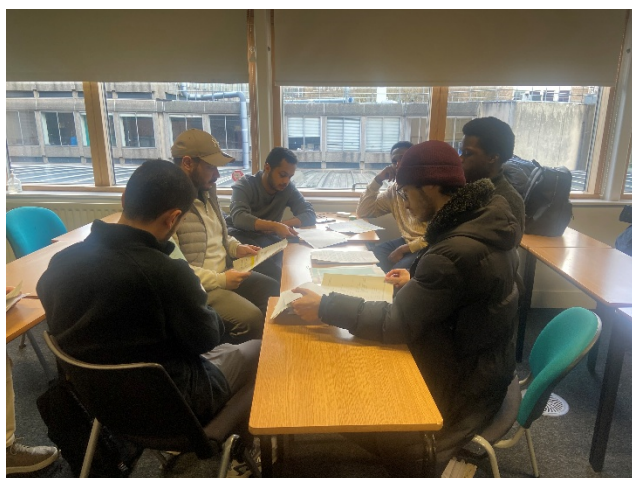
On the same day, an UAE Process Safety Workshop was held for the third year and attended by students from:
